## THE MARYLAND INN



The Maryland Inn has 44 charming historic guest rooms equipped with modern amenities such as 42" flat screen Cable TVs, hairdryers, complimentary high speed internet, phones, and private baths with luxurious Gilchrist & Soames toiletries. There are also luxury suites, featuring Historic king or queen beds, 3,000 square feet of meeting space, and a ballroom which seats up to 80 people.

Depending on your vantage point, you can enjoy a view of the State House, the waterfront, or Annapolis' famous Main Street. Many of these guestrooms date to the revolutionary era. The Maryland Inn has hosted presidents, governors and statesmen, including eleven delegates of the 1786 U.S. Congress and now attracts visitors from all over who are intrigued by its rich tradition and place in American history.

Starbuck's Coffee, Our Drummer's Lot Pub and famous Treaty of Paris restaurant are located in the Maryland Inn. For over 200 years, the Treaty of Paris has been one of the top restaurants in Annapolis. In 2004, the Treaty of Paris was inducted into the Hospitality Hall of Honor by the Maryland Restaurant Association.



## GOVERNOR CALVERT HOUSE



This historic home was once lived in by two former Maryland governors both named Calvert. Now it is a tastefully restored Colonial and Victorian Inn with over 7,000 square feet of meeting space. The Inn also features the famous Hypocaust, a unique greenhouse system discovered in the basement of the building, which continues to draw tourists who are visiting Annapolis.

The Governor Calvert House has 51 elegant guest rooms. All historic rooms are equipped with modern amenities such as 42" flat screen Cable TVs, hairdryers, complimentary high speed internet, phones, and private baths with luxurious Gilchrist & Soames toiletries. There are luxury suites, featuring Historic king or queen beds. The building faces the State House on one side and Terrace Gardens on the other.

Of all the Historic Inn Properties The Governor Calvert House hosts the most meetings, weddings, social functions and other catered events which utilize the beautiful Atrium and Calvert Ballroom venues. The ballroom seats up to 200 people.



## ROBERT JOHNSON HOUSE



In 1772, an Annapolis Barber by the name of Robert Johnson purchased town lot #73 from a local silversmith named John Steele. In 1773, his grandson would build the brick house which still stands at 23 School Street. The house passed through the hands of many owners as the centuries passed. It would later be converted into a lodging facility.

The Robert Johnson House has 29 guest-rooms furnished with antiques and reproductions. The paint, upholstery and draperies in the guest rooms were carefully selected to make the most of each room's location, and exposure to sunlight. The Inn offers a great view of the State House and the State Circle. The rooms are equipped with modern amenities such as 42" flat screen Cable TVs, hairdryers, complimentary high speed internet, phones, and private baths with luxurious Gilchrist & Soames toiletries. Luxury suites, feature king or queen beds.

As with all the Historic Inns, visitors are within walking distance of shops, restaurants, entertainment, United States Naval Academy and the heart of the historic district.
